OUR PLAN What is our strategy?

We also provide opportunities for godly friendships in our small groups, games, events, and camps.

Partner with parents. We believe that parents have the biggest influence and are the best disciple-makers of their students. For this reason, we aim to partner with parents to see students grow in Christlikeness. We want to be a supplement to the disciple-making that is already going on in the home. We also desire to partner with parents at youth related events - we love when parents are small group leaders and when they team up to host fun events and activities.

OUR PLACE What is our role?

We expect our youth leaders to advance our mission through the following actions:

- By regular personal time in the Word of God and prayer.
- By regular attendance at the main service at Bethany.

LOVE THE BODY BY BUILDING UP THE CHURCH OF JESUS THROUGH WORK

- By leading / co-leading small group discussion on a weekly basis.
- By faithfully praying for the needs of your youth and their parents.
- By regularly attending all youth leader meetings (Shepherding Huddles), so far as this is possible (Please communicate with appropriate ministry staff if you cannot attend).
 - Middle School Meetings from 8:15-9pm 9/27, 10/25, 11/15
 - High School Meetings from 8:15-9pm 9/13, 10/11, 11/8
- By regularly attending each Wednesday night youth group, so far as this is possible (Please communicate with appropriate ministry staff & youth leaders if you cannot attend.)
- By participating in activities / games and large group time on Wednesday nights.
- By engaging students with spiritual conversations.
- By contacting each student in your small group <u>at least once a month</u>. Note anyways we can care and pray for them.
- By contacting the parent(s) of students in your small group <u>at least once a semester</u> and talk about opportunities to lovingly shepherd that student.
- (Optional; for HS only) By participating / leading an IMPACT team (note the IMPACT packet provided)

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LOVE THE LOST BY REACHING OUT TO THOSE WITHOUT JESUS THROUGH WITNESS

- By creating a welcoming atmosphere of love and friendship.
- Reaching out to students for Christ through relationships, programs, and activities.
- By challenging and encouraging students to share the gospel in their communities and schools.

We expect our youth leaders to engage students who are disruptive by:

Ask the student to listen to instructions / directions.



Prompt the student to remember what our standard is if their disruptive behavior persists.

Separate the student from others if their behavior is distracting and preventing others from engaging.

Tell the Youth Minister of the situation so that parents can be notified if necessary.



*Demonstrate a gentle and loving spirit when addressing student behavior. Make the most of the situation by discussing the gospel and pointing them to Christ.
